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COMMISSION ENDORSES GOVERNOR'S REORGANIZATION PLAN

The Little Hoover Commission on Tuesday recommended that the Legislature allow Government Reorganization Plan No. 2 to go into effect.

The Commission's vote was 7-0, with one legislative member abstaining.

Governor Edmund G. Brown, Jr., submitted the reorganization plan to the Commission on March 30, 2012 and submitted the plan to the Legislature on May 3, 2012.

The Commission's recommendation is based on testimony given at public hearings it held on April, 23, 24, and 25, 2012, in Sacramento, as well as written comment submitted to the Commission and previous work in relevant areas.

If the Legislature takes no action, the plan will go into effect on July 3, 2012 and become operative July 1, 2013. The plan can be rejected by a majority vote in either house.

Once final revisions are made, the Commission's report on its recommendation will be available on its web site.
